





Pet Parade and Kids Activities



The June 27 kid's events draw huge crowds during Jim Bowie Days and they will all three be in the Bowie Community Center.

For the Kiddie Pet Parade, set for noon, children dress up their pets for a chance to win prizes for most unusual, best dressed, best groomed and most lovable pet.

Participation is free and is open to ages 16 and younger. Registration is required prior to the show. All pets much be on a leash, in a carrier or crate, held in your hands and may not be more than 36 inches tall.

Turtle racing and frog jumping are open to age categories five and under and six and up. Terrapin races start at 1 p.m. with prizes awarded for prettiest and fasted turtle in each age category. Frog jumping is at 1:30 p.m. with prizes for longest jump and smallest frog in each age category.



Youth Rodeo

The Jim Bowie Days Youth Rodeo will take place at 7 p.m. on June 23 and 24 in the Bowie Rodeo Association Arena in Bowie.

Mutton bustin' will be both nights with a limit of 10 contestants per night. It is open to ages six and under.

On June 23, speed events of barrels, poles and goats will run. Age groups are six and under, 7-10, 11-14 and 15-19. There is no leadline. Entry fee is \$25.

On June 24 roping events for breakaway, ribbon, tie-down and team roping are scheduled. It is open to ages 13 and under and ages 14-19. Entry fee is \$35.

There is a \$10 office charge per contestant.

Boys and girls will compete together based on their age as of Jan. 1, 2019. An




all-around buckle will go to the top boy and girl based on combined points from both nights. There is 70 percent payback.

There will be a hamburger feed after the parade at 11 a.m. on June 29 at the Bowie Community Center.










Indian Artifact Show







Jim Bowie Rodeo organizers invite you to run in the 4D Barrels and then return to run during the Jim Bowie Days Rodeo later in the week


Expos will be 5:30 to 7:15 p.m. with races starting at 7:30 p.m. Expos are \$5.


Entry fee for the race is \$25 with a \$5 office charge (per person not horse).


There will be 75 percent payback plus \$500 added money.





Rodeo queens have been shining at rodeos for many years. Their role has evolved from a pretty girl on horseback to a "total package" of an athlete and public relations ambassador for the sport and festival.

Entering a pageant and winning a title can provide many life skill experiences for today's young cowgirl. The rodeo queen represents her rodeo, association or region for a standard time of usually 12 months and is usually required to wear a cowboy hat, crown and banner with her title on it.

Being a rodeo queen requires skills in western style horse riding, public speaking, rodeo knowledge, appropriate appearance and personality.

Rodeo Queens spend their time professionally representing their title at various rodeos, parades, public events, television interviews, radio interviews, school events, and charity events. The 2019 Miss Jim Bowie Days was Faith Garrett, while the 2019 Little Miss was Brooke Smith.

The contest will be on June 26 with horsemanship at 8 a.m. in the rodeo arena, Brunch and interviews follow afterward. Contestants also are required to ride in the grand entry all three nights of the rodeo and the parade, as well as attend the festivities' events.

The 2020 JBD Queen Elect receives a saddle certificate from Teskey's, \$500 college scholarship, clothing allowance and more. Little Miss will receive a saddle certificate from Teskey's, clothing allowance and more.
